



Minutes of the Board of Studies

18.05.2021 Platform : Google Meet

The Board of Studies Meeting was held on 18.05.2021 at 10AM on Google Meet. The meeting began with a silent prayer. The head of the department welcomed the University Representative, Dr. D. E. Benet, Associate Professor of English, National College(Autonomous), Trichy, the subject expert, Dr. J. John Sekar, Associate Professor, The American College, Madurai, Expert from Industry, Mr. W. Jesuraj, Proprietor, American Pharma and Science, Trichy, Alumni Representative, Mr. R.Anbuselvam, B.T. Asst. English, Sri Vivekananda Vidhyavanam High School, Thirupparaithurai and all the staff members from both Shift I and Shift II. After a brief introduction by the Head and the experts, the staff members presented the syllabus for suggestions.

Following were the suggestions offered by Experts on UG English programme:

- 1. In *English Literary Forms & Terms*, Dr.Benet suggested that in addition to origin of Drama, the various forms of plays evolved can be included.
- 2. In *History of English Literature*, Dr.Benet suggested including literature written in the 20th century and after. He also suggested a book titled *Routledge History of English Literature* to incorporate chapters on 20th century literature.
- 3. Dr.J.John Sekar pointed out the number of hours for *General English* exceeded the fixed hours and change should be made.
- 4. In *Neoclassical Literature*, Dr.J.John Sekar suggested including anthologies under books for study instead of mentioning individual works. Dr.Benet also suggested replacing Jonathan Swift's novel to one of the gothic novels.
- 5. In *Romantic Literature*, Dr.Benet mentioned that the prescribed Shelley's drama was closet drama and he recommended either prose pieces or novels can be included.
- 6. In *Diasporic Literature*, Dr.Benet asked to ensure if the writers prescribed are diasporic writers.
- 7. Dr.Benet recommended that texts related to nonsense verse can be included in *Creative Writing Writing Poetry*.
- 8. In *Victorian Literature*, the experts felt Unit V was heavy and therefore suggested removing one novel from the unit.
- 9. In *Contemporary British literature*, Dr.Benet felt Tom Stoppard's *Arcadia* will be difficult for UG students and recommended to include a different work.
- 10. Dr. J. John Sekar suggested including a couple of units for practice in *News Reporting & Editing* and units for Reporting in other media.
- 11. Dr.Benet suggested that few Tamil films can be included under movies to watch in *Film Studies*.
- 12. Dr.Benet made a suggestion to remove one novel and include one more drama by modern playwrights in *American Literature*.
- 13. Dr.Benet suggested that new critics can be included in *History of Literary Criticism* since the concepts are repeated in a separate paper on T.S.Eliot and there was no scope for introducing the new critics except T.S.Eliot.
- 14. Mr. Anbu Selvan suggested that students should be engaged in practical sessions for *English Language Teaching Theory and Practice*.

- 15. Dr. Benet suggested that one of the "Four Quarters" can be included in the paper titled *An Intensive Study of an author* : *T.S.Eliot*
- 16. Dr. J. John Sekar made a suggestion to replace the title *English for Media Studies* as *English for the Media*.

Following were the suggestions offered by Experts on PG English programme:

- 1. Experts felt that there were repetitions of literary works from UG programmes in British Literature. Based on their suggestions, Dr. Francis explained that only 20 percent of our own students continue to study M.A in our college and also the classical works cannot be neglected. Therefore, repetitions cannot be avoided.
- 2. In *Indian Writing in English*, Dr. J. John Sekar suggested including one of the recent novels by writers like Amitav Ghosh instead of one novel by early writer.
- 3. In *Introduction to Literary Theories*, Dr.Benet suggested that the theories in each unit can be categorized and theories like Posthumanism, Feminism and Critical Race theory can be incorporated.
- 4. In *Self-Paced: Shakespeare*, Dr.Benet made a suggestion to replace a tragedy with one of the tragicomedies of Shakespeare.
- 5. Dr.John Sekar suggested changing the title of the paper *Indian Literatures translated into English* as *Indian Literatures in Translation*. Dr.Benet suggested adding translated short stories of Mahasweta Devi and other Malayalam writers.
- 6. In *Comparative Literature and Translation Studies*, experts suggested including a unit concentrating on comparison of Literature and Art forms.
- 7. In *Gender Studies*, Dr.Benet recommended topics like Gender and Language in the introduction and suggested books for the same.
- 8. Dr.John Sekar suggested changing the title of *Postmodern Studies* as *Postmodernist Literature* to be specific and relevant to the contents of the units. Dr.Benet suggested including Salman Rushdie's *Midnight's Children* instead of *One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest*
- 9. In *Postcolonial Literatures*, Dr.Benet suggested that an Australian or Canadian novel can be included to replace Salman Rushdie's novel.
- 10. Dr.Benet recommended changing the title of *Western Aesthetics* as *Aesthetic Studies / Aesthetics* and Dr.John Sekar suggested that one unit on Indian Aesthetics/ oriental aesthetics should be incorporated with this new title.
- 11. In *Research Methodology*, experts suggested books and manuals to be included under Books for Study.
- 12. Dr.Benet suggested a practice that was followed by Bharathidasan University and other institutions where descriptive questions are included for *English for Competitive Examinations* so that Students will not find it difficult to score.

After the presentation of individual papers, the head of the department invited the experts to give their overall feedback of the syllabus. Dr.Benet mentioned that the syllabus was need-based and student-centred. It was also unique in nature. He also suggested getting ready with online lecture for each paper in future. Dr. J. John Sekar appreciated the cooperative effort amidst the challenges of the tedious task of syllabus revision and thanked everyone. Mr. Jesuraj spelled out that the syllabus in future can concentrate more on employability skills and professional Communication. Mr. Anbu Selvan mentioned that the suggestions they placed as students, were implemented in the current syllabus and appreciated the collective effort. Finally, Dr. Jayapaul, the Head thanked the experts and the staff members for their time and support. The meeting came to an end at 1.30 p.m.

Minutes of Board of Studies Meeting held on 18.05.2021

Board of Studies meeting was held at Department Google Classroom at 10.00 am on 18th May, 2021 through online mode. The meeting began at 10.15 am to discuss UG History Syllabus 2021. The meeting was inaugurated by Dr. K. Lingammal, Head (i/c) with a prayer. She welcomed the panel members of BoS i.e. University Representative, Subject Expert, Industrial Expert and Student Representative and internal members for the meeting. Then Dr K. Lingammal requested Dr. S. Manikandan to present UG History Syllabus 2021 to the panel members for discussion.

Dr. S. Manikandan started presenting the syllabus by giving an introduction to the revised syllabus and exploring the idea followed to revise and update the UG History Syllabus 2021. He explained that the present syllabus was revised based on Learning Outcome Based Curriculum Framework (LOCF) proposed by UGC. Beside he assured that the revised syllabus would have importance of local, regional, national and international history and the revised syllabus would fulfill the expectations of the students who try for higher education, interested in Competitive exams and would be qualified for job opportunities available in tourism industry, record offices and museums particularly.

At first Dr. S. Manikandan presented Programme Outcome and Programme Specific Outcome of the Department. He sought the panel members for suggestions after presenting Course Outcome and content of each paper. He completed his presentation by 12.50 pm. The experts shared their views on revised syllabus and gave their valuable suggestions. 

Suggestions and Views received:

1.Introduction of a simple overview about Block-Chain Technologies and Artificial Intelligence to our students in order to enhance their knowledge development on trending concepts and employability skills.

- 2. Reference Books stated should be of Latest Edition, at least from the year 2015 onwards and the mention of Chapters covered by respective Text Book was not required.
- 3. With regard to selection of MOOC Course Students should not select the same course which should be already covered under syllabus
- 4. Alumni should contribute to the junior students by way of Guest Lecture and conduct workshops
- 5. The Subject Title to Business Data Analytics, instead of Business Data Analytics in Excel.
- 6. To include Heath Care Management, which is gaining vital significance especially during this Corona Crisis period
- 7.To Use the word "Text Book" instead of "Book For Study" and remove the chapters mentioned since it might vary according to the year of edition.
- 8. Include the concept of Business Environment exclusively under Strategic Management
- 9. It was suggested that the Role of DIC (District Industries Centre) could be added under the subject "Start-Ups and Small Business Management".
- 10. The concepts covered under the Subject "Security Analysis and Portfolio Management was heavy overload for UG Level .

- 8. Business Environment topic added in the Strategic Management Subject.
- 9. Role of DIC added in the subject "Start-Ups and Small business management."

Minutes of the Board of Studies Meeting held on May 18, 2021

Owing to the Covid Lockdown, the meeting was held online through the Counselling Psychology Staff Classroom.

The meeting started with a prayer song played by Fr. Richard.

Fr. Emmanuel welcomed the members and asked them to introduce themselves. After the self-introduction of all the members, Fr. Emmanuel mentioned briefly about the Department of Counselling Psychology at St. Joseph's College, Trichy, and what happened during the past one year. he stated that

- the Dept. of Counselling Psychology was started at St. Joseph's College in 2020 and just one year is over after we started the M.A. Counselling Psychology;
- despite the Lockdown due to Covid-19, and despite the drawbacks of teaching online, intense teaching-learning has taken place;
- the focus of the program is twofold: Personal Development and Professional Development;
- the outcome of the program should be that students acquire knowledge, skills and the right attitude to bloom into efficient and ethical counsellors;
- the current students are motivated to learn;
- students go through personal counselling, for which during the last semester alone each student met the counsellors six times for understanding themselves
- during the Lockdown, the Dept. conducted two webinars on relevant themes one International and another one National; besides the presentations by external experts, all the students in the Dept. presented papers during both the webinars;
- during the second year of the program, the students will be doing their practicum for which they have a class called Supervision, during which they will integrate theory and practice, their own personality and their preferred approach;
- to the suggestion given by Dr.Jeryda that the Dept. should help out in counselling during this Covid Lockdown, Fr. Emmanuel thanked her for the suggestion and added that it is already being done online. He also stated that the students visited St. Joseph's College Hr. Sec. School and gave talks and did counselling to the students, and visited and conducted counselling thrice at the Alcohol Treatment camp conducted by JMAADD at Mullaikudy.

Suggestions Received

The syllabus is well-prepared, quite packed, and the Electives are relevant. However, the course on Psychological Approaches to Counselling would be the core theoretical input, and therefore it would require a longer duration as theoretical input should be combined with practicing various theories. It could be taught as Psychological Approaches to Counselling I and II. The time table has to be reorganized accordingly. Fr. Richard explained that theory is taught with a demo, and the students practice and come back with the transcript of their counselling. Fr. Emmanuel added that one hour in the afternoon is allotted for practicing these approaches, and moreover, in Family Therapy, the students are remined of various approaches to counselling.

In the subject, Foundations of Psychology, the Unit on The Five Senses could be included under Perception along with a separate Unit as Motivation and Emotions.Fr. Emmanuel clarified that on account of the Lockdown, the Unit on the Nervous System was omitted and the topic on Motivation was dealt with in detail.

In the Semester 2, in the course on Psychology of Human Development, the topic *Terminally Ill* should be included. Dr. John Balaiah explained that that topic is given as a case study.

The syllabus is modified to include one more course on Psychological Approaches to

Counselling as Paper I and Paper II.

In the Subject on the Foundations of Psychology, the unit on the Nervous System is merged with the first Unit on Introduction, the third unit is titled as Perception and the last unit is titled as Motivation and Emotions.

In the subject on the Psychology of Human Development, though the topic on the Terminally ill was actually dealt with as a case study, it is specifically mentioned in the syllabus.

- 7. To give priority to internships, projects and field visits so that students can gain practical exposure
- 8. To encourage students to go for startups and incubations
- 9. Already there is a course on Research Methodology in the PG programme, so there is no need to have teaching hours (Hours-6) for the course Project. Project hours with credits shall be allotted to staff for guidance purpose only.
- 10. The course Allied 2 (Optional) Basic Econometrics in semester IV, has been taken into semester V. In that place the new course Entrepreneurial Development has been added. The courses History of Economic Thought I and II merged as one course as History of Economic Thought and this course is placed in the VI semester.

Subject Expert 1: Dr. Karvembu

He observed that the PG inorganic syllabus should be rearranged to start coordination chemistry in semester I and continue it in semester II with the inclusion of organometallic compounds, it would facilitate the students who appear for competitive examination like CSIR. He insisted that catalysis and reaction mechanism may be included in organometallic chemistry in semester II. He also suggested that elementary topics already dealt in UG should not be dealt again in detail PG as it would amount to repetition. Instead the focus should be given to advanced topics like inorganic spectroscopy. He noted that UG syllabus appears good in content hence may be carried on without much rearrangement.

Subject Expert 2: Dr. Saravanan

He noted that more recent reference books can be included in both UG and PG syllabus.

Industrial Expert: Dr. ThiayagarajanSaravanan

He observed that more industry oriented topics may be included in order equip students to face interviews with confidence.

Student Representative: Mr. X. Joe Sam,

He pointed that tautomerism(in imine bond) apart from keto-enoltautomerism and topics related to C-H activation may be included PG organic chemistry syllabus. In PG physical chemistry syllabus 2nd order perturbation may be included in perturbation theory.

The meeting concluded with a vote of thanks proposed by Dr. A.N. Paul Angelo, Dean of Physical Sciences, he thanked all the external members and faculty for their valuable suggestions.

Martin, IP Marketing and Distributions (P), St. Anne's complex, Convent Road, Melaputhur, Trichy, Alumni of the department Mr. R. Ramakrishnan, School of Physics, Nonlinear Dynamics Center, Bharathidasan University, Trichy and all the Faculty members of the Department except Mr. S. Dominique were present.

The Chairman of the Board, Dr. I. Arul Rayappan, HoD welcomed the External members and the faculty members of both Shift – I & Shift – II.

The UG course pattern was presented and left for discussion.

University Representative Dr. R. Raj Muhamed mentioned that no credits were allotted for Physics Practical I&II in Semester I & III.

Dr. I. Arul Rayappan clarified that the practical examinations for Physics Practical I & II are conducted at the end of the year and the credits are given in the Semester II & IV respectively.

The Subject Expert, Dr. K. Marimuthu, gave two suggestions in UG course pattern

1. Place the Optics course in second year and the Electromagnetism course in third year with a justification that optics experiments are simple can be taught in UG I&II year.

2. In Discipline Specific Elective, DSE (A) for theoretical physics and DSE (B) for applied physics (Electronics). An option for students to study either theoretical

physics or applied physics.

Dr. N.Ravi explained that higher number of Electromagnetism experiments are taught during first and second years as compared to Optics based experiments which makes the foundation for applied physics experiments in the third year with due weightage to Optics experiments.

Dr. S.Alfred Cecil Raj pointed out the course pattern was framed in accordance with DSE (A) for average learners and DSE (B) for fast learners. The same was acknowledged by Dr. J. Charles. Dr I. Arul Rayappan further clarified that, this UG course pattern is a balanced UG level foundation in both theoretical and applied physics.

The Subject Expert agreed the members' explanations.

Industrial expert suggested that the core course can be made more interesting among the students by specifying the field of opportunity in every course of study.

A new Question paper pattern based on LOCF proposed by the Department

Dr. N. Ravi briefed the Three question patterns from Dean and also presented the proposed pattern of Physics Department with all aspects like cognitive domain levels and their corresponding weightage marks in percentage for both Semester and CIA (Mid & End Semesters). Also added the QP pattern was framed on the basis of 70% weightage of lower cognitive levels K1,K2&K3 for average learners and 30% weightage of higher cognitive levels K4,K5&K6 for fast learners. Explained K1 level questions in Section -A, K2 level questions in Section – B, K3 level Questions in Section – C and K4,K5,K6 level questions in Section – D.

Question paper pattern proposed from PHYSICS Department Rationale:

- 1. Unitisation is to be followed in the question papers for SEMESTER EXAM and MID&END Semester TESTS
- 2. Different Cognitive Levels (K1 to K6) should be weighed at different scales
- 3. The weightage for Lower Order Thinking (LOT –K1,K2,K3) could be 70%, as per our students' background
- 4. Examinations of fixed hour duration, first FOUR K Levels are to be given more weightage

Background for our proposal

- o **Blooms Taxonomy is Hierarchical** meaning that learning at the higher level requires that skills at a lower levels are already attained.
- o Normally the first four levels (Learning Levels K1 to K4) are meant for <u>fixed hour</u> examinations (CIA & SE) while the **last three levels** (Learning Levels K4 to K6)

- meant for Course Projects, Internship, etc. though which students' are assessed and attainment levels of the individual student and class have to compute.

- o 45% weightage for Higher Order Thinking leads to lowering of % scored in each course for students. Hence it should be at weighed lower level.
- o Each Learning Level should be identified.
- Learning Levels should be in congruence with the Syllabus for attainment study for a student as well as for the Course. Also for attainment calculation in terms of COs, POs/PSOs.
